



# Better Security, Better Care



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- National programme funded by NHSX
- Its aim is to help make sure adult social care providers have good data and cyber security in place
- By helping care providers to register on and complete the Data Security and Protection Toolkit (DSPT)
- The DSPT is a self assessment to support you to check your practice against national data standards
- Local and national support e.g. Digital Social Care - dedicated space to provide advice and support to the sector on technology and data protection

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## Compliance

- General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR)
- CQC Key Lines of Enquiry
- CQC Guidance “What good looks like for digital records in adult social care”
- NHS Continuing Health Care contracts
- Local authority contracts
- Registration with the Information Commissioner’s Office (ICO)

# Why is data and cyber security in social care important?



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Risk

- Data breaches, including:
  - Risks to people's rights and freedoms
  - Fines
  - Reputational damage
- Cyber attacks, including:
  - Loss of money
  - Loss of care records/
  - Risk to service delivery
- Digital exclusion

# Why is data and cyber security in social care important?



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Opportunity


- Business sustainability
- Business continuity in the face of (data) emergencies
- Meet people's and families' expectations
- Improve communications by using NHSMail
- Access local shared health and care records

# Data security and protection lead



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- A new role for social care
- Takes overall senior responsibility for data security and protection
- Usually incorporated into someone's existing role but has additional skills and knowledge
- Elements of the role can be delegated
- The role must be formally assigned – e.g. in their job description
- The role is not mandatory but is seen as best practice



# Why should your organisation have a senior lead role?



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- A significant and important area of work
- High levels of risk
- Importance of compliance
- Able to see opportunities
- Strategic oversight needed for the whole business or service
- One person to take overall responsibility
- At a senior enough level to set the culture
- Practical tasks can be delegated to others

# Other Specialist Roles



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## Data Protection Officer

- Under legislation (GDPR) certain types of organisations must appoint a Data Protection Officer (DPO)
- For social care providers this is likely to only apply to large multi-site organisations

## Caldicott Guardian

- Responsible for protecting the confidentiality of people's health and care information and making sure that it is used properly
- Mandatory for all NHS organisations and local authorities providing social services
- Not mandatory for social care providers

## Senior Information Risk Officer

- Responsible for managing information risks in an organisation
- Can be part of the Data Security and Protection Lead role






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# Make sure the rights of individuals are upheld



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


- Lawfulness, fairness and transparency

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

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

- Keep a record

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# Complete the Data Security and Protection Toolkit (DSPT) annually



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- The DSPT is a really helpful guide and self-assessment tool for data security in social care
- Helps you keep people's confidential information safe
- Helps protect your business from the risk of being fined for a data breach and from the disruption of a cyberattack
- The DSPT will demonstrate compliance with CQC requirements
- It's what local councils and CCGs will expect you to have
- The DSPT will be your passport to shared care records with health services
